Program Of Classic And Folk Music At Museum Today

A varied program of classic and folk music for guitar, recorder and voice will be presented at 3 p.m. today in the Heard Museum, 22 East Monte Vista Rd., under the sponsorship of the Phoenix Classic Guitar Society. The public is invited without charge.

Joining seven members of the Guitar Society will be four musicians from the newly organized Phoenix Chapter of the American Recorder Society. The group will perform works

of Bach, Haydn, Handel and Francesco Tarrega.

Music of the new world will be sung by Barbara Stein, Vaughn and Naomi Kalajan, in a group of some of America's best-loved folk songs.

Organized six years ago, the Phoenix Classic Guitar Society is dedicated to promoting, developing and sustaining the classic, or true guitar, and to assist the music-loving public in discovering the tonal beauty

and vast musical literature of the classic guitar. President of the local group, and one of today's performers, is John Tanno.

The recorder, an ancient wood instrument, has had a recent rebirth of popularity throughout the country, and is prized for its expressive and plaintive tone.
